Chapter IV A

Fundamental Duties

ARTICLE 51A

Fundamental Duties- It shall be the duty of every citizen of India-

- (a) to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- (b) to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- (c) to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- (d) to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities, to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- (f) to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- (g) to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life and to have compassion for living creatures;
- (h) to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- (i) to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- (j) to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement:
- (k) who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his child or, as the case may be, ward between the age of six and fourteen years.

Teacher's Page

The present textbook for XI th standard students learning Russian aims at developing the following four skills of the students, namely

- 1. Reading
- 2. Writing
- 3. Listening
- 4. Speaking

The competence in each of the above four aspects of language learning are closely related to each other and hence equal emphasis should be given to all the four of them. Today the aim of learning a language is being able to communicate (orally or in written form) in that language and also to be able to understand communication made (either orally or through writing) in that language.

These four skills of language acquisition are based on three aspects of language, namely phonetics, lexicon and grammar. Having a good grounding in phonetics helps learners to listen and quickly comprehend speech in that language. It also helps them improve their own diction and speak with reasonably good diction and pronunciation.

It is recommended that the teachers focus on the phonetic aspect of Russian initially, especially the first four to five weeks making the students read out loud, making the students do phonetic drills, paying attention to palatalization, stressed and de-stressed vowels, voiced and voiceless consonents and intonation of various types of sentences like narrative, interrogative and exclamatory. Some pointers are given in the textbook immediately after the alphabet. As fun element some tongue twisters are also given. (Especially for sounds that may be alien to learners from Maharashtra and also some for palatalization)

In this introductory course, the teachers can also introduce the learners to printed script and the cursive script. Since the learners are required to acquire a new script it is advised, that the teacher take a lot of practice by way of reading out loud exercises, Dictations, quizzes for finding words having similar sounds etc. The learners apart from acquiring new vocabulary learn to distinguish between animate and inanimate objects, genders of the nouns

denoting these objects and their plurals.

The grammatical constructions which are required to conduct day to day conversations include nouns and their forms in Nominative, Prepositional, Accusative and Genitive Cases, adverbs, adjectives and their declensions as per gender and number, Verbs (both transitive and intransitive, as also the verb of motion идти).

The vocabulary, which the learners are expected to acquire is given at the end of the text book. It consists of approximately 900 words. Most of the words given in the vocabulary are used in the texts and the exercises. However there might be stray instances, where the words are not given in the vocabulary. The teachers are supposed to explain them.

Language learning process also generates a tremendous curiosity about a different culture, different people. Keeping this in mind, we have provided a lot of visual and information stimulus to the learners. They should be encouraged to use the resources available online and share them with friends.

Within the classroom, the teacher should adopt communicative approach, encourage dialogue and interaction. The teachers are expected to encourage speech in Russian within the classroom. The teachers should also initiate some extra-mural activity like poetry recitation, wall journal, scrap book about Russia etc. This gives a lot of boost to the learners motivation and makes the language learning process more enjoyable.

A Student is able to:

- Introduce oneself and others.
- Converse on Meetings, farewells and Greeting phrases of basic politeness.
- Interact in a class- room situation and post queries for eg. Please repeat, can you go slowly etc.
- Describe an individual or thing using adjectives.
- Tell and ask time and describe one's daily routine and leisure time activities.
- Express likes and dislikes in all day- to- day situations.
- Express apologies and regrets.
- Have basic interaction in the various situations such as asking directions, Shopping, Asking for assistance
- Describe their workplace, house.
- Talk about their family and friends.
- Describe pictures

- Read aloud with correct pronunciation and tone.
- Appreciates clarity, precision, transparency in the given text at the time of reading.
- Reads the poems with correct rhythms.
- Learns to give correct pauses, breaks at the time of reading.
- Adopt correct reading strategies depending upon different types of texts and purpose of reading.
- Develop curiosity through effective reading.

A Student is able to:

- Understand and read numbers e.g. telephone nos, mobile nos, postal code
- Read and understand basic information in the menu cards, invitations, posters, visiting cards.
- · Read and understand certain basic pictures.
- Read and understand medium difficulty level texts and solve questions based on the same.
- Read given poem with correct rhythm and pronunciation.



- To develop skill to write the Russian characters correctly.
- Follow correct stroke order while writing.
- Develop habit of writing coherently, concisely and clearly.
- Review and if necessary correct own written script for better.
- Attempts to different creative styles of writing like poems, texts ,etc.

A student is able to

- Write very simple informal messages e.g. a text message or a note to tell someone when and where to meet.
- Write brief messages like postcards and birthday greetings.
- Write simple information about themselves e.g. name, age, address, and hobbies.
- Write simple descriptions of everyday objects e.g. colour and size of a vehicle, a brief description of their home.
- Fill in a questionnaire with personal details.
- Complete gapped sentences using a word list of familiar words
