Fundamental Duties

ARTICLE 51A

- (k) who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his child or, as the case may be, ward between the age of six and fourteen years.



INTRODUCTION

This coursebook in French (Composite Course for Std.IX), «Le Français, c'est un atout!» is based on the new curriculum of French at the Secondary level. Teachers, parents and students therefore, need to understand the features of the curriculum which are:

The curriculum is

- 1. skill-based.
- 2. need-based.
- 3. learner-centered.
- 4. value-oriented.

Current thinking in curriculum development and its implementation and the views and opinions expressed by teachers on the existing curriculum framework have been taken into consideration while preparing this course book.

The general objectives of teaching / learning French:

«Le Français, c'est un atout!» is prepared keeping in mind the specific needs and interests of the students of Std.IX Composite Course and the teaching / learning situation of French in schools in Maharashtra. For the first time, coloured illustrations and maps have been introduced to generate and sustain the interest of the learner.

Structure of «Le Français, c'est un atout!»:

This new book, like «Le Français, c'est fun!» prescribed for Std VIII Composite Course, has a thematic design.

With Paris as its canvas, the book contains seven lessons having a thematic unity. The themes have been chosen with great care taking into consideration the interests of students.

Each lesson is further divided into seven sub-units:

Every lesson opens with a dialogue on the main theme. The themes have been chosen considering the student's age, social / cultural background and aspirations. Thus, all the themes are culturally, sociologically and educationally appropriate.

It is followed by the communication aspect related to or chosen from the main theme. Various speech acts are taught in the main text. The communication aspect carries the development further. A supplementary text follows the above sub-unit in the form of a short paragraph. Narrative and descriptive in nature, it highlights one particular point in the main text. This section allows for the development of reading and writing skills.

Sections on vocabulary and grammar introduce new words, expressions and grammar topics in accordance with the lesson. Explanation for the grammar section is given in English for easy understanding of the concepts. Revision of certain important topics has also been included. A glossary covering the topics in the lesson (Main text – Communication – Supplementary text – Vocabulary – Grammar – Exercises) have been provided at the end of the book.

Ample exercises to cover all aspects of language learning have also been provided. These will help to fix and to reinforce topics covered in the lessons. Exercises on phonetics have also been set.

The last section of each lesson is a short text in easy French on Civilization. Texts covering a wide range of topics including environment, ecology, wildlife conservation as well as those inculcating international understanding and Indo-French relations have also been included.

NOTE FOR TEACHERS, PARENTS & STUDENTS

The teacher plays a vital role in foreign language learning. The organization and structure of each lesson will help the teacher devise strategies for the group, as essentially the large number of students in the classroom and the time allotted are the main factors to be taken into consideration.

As «student-centered learning» is the focus, an effort has been made to organize the learning material and tasks to encourage the learner to learn independently. At the same time, group work/pair work tasks have been proposed.

Developing reading / listening skill:

The coursebook «Le Français, c'est un atout!» is accompanied by an audio CD. It comes with the textbook. The main text, the communication section, the supplementary text and the phonetic exercises of all the lessons are all on the audio CD.

All the above-mentioned sections require reading/listening in class as this interactivity helps. Poems should be read out and the learner should be encouraged to read them aloud. The participation of the students also helps develop ease in speaking the language.

In the class, the first listening activity could be that of listening to the CD. The student too could go over the same at home. The CD is a very good tool to develop the listening skill.

The CD is especially useful for the phonetic exercises. Parts of the book recorded in the audio CD are indicated by the symbol.

Speaking skill:

The Communication section which follows the main text, covers this skill specifically. The teacher can ask the learners in pairs or in groups to enact this section in pairs or in groups.

The learner should be encouraged through small activities such as role- play, poetry recitation and small skits to communicate in French at all times. Exercises have been provided in the lessons on the communication aspect.

Vocabulary:

Vocabulary and expressions related to the themes have been included in the section. A glossary is provided at the end of the book.

The aim of the vocabulary tasks is to encourage expansion, memorization and enrichment of vocabulary, always keeping in mind the fun element.

Grammar:

All grammar topics have been explained in English for easy comprehension. The concepts have been further illustrated with numerous examples to clarify them.

A revision of a few important topics from Std. VIII has also been included.

There are plenty of exercises. Grammar exercises focus on mastering the concepts. Therefore, the exercises progress from very simple to the complex.

Writing:

Writing tasks have been included in most chapters in some form. These may vary from simple question-answer type activity to guided writing.

The learner should also be encouraged to write small skits and articles as they encourage creativity.

Comprehension:

Comprehension passages have been included with a view to encourage the learner to read, understand and pick up the finer details of structure and information.

These passages can also be used for reading and for translation.

Translation:

Texts for translation from French to English have also been provided. These help the learner

to understand the structure of the French language and express himself in correct English. It also provides for a better understanding of the two languages.

«Le Français, c'est un atout!» is designed as a composite book. It contains the main learning material as well as the student's workbook material (exercises in the grammar section) and instructions to the teacher.

For teachers:

The teacher's role is vital as s/he needs to highlight the fact that French is not just another subject to be studied. Learning it opens wider avenues in the student's career. The teacher is the real and the most important motivator for developing an interest and love for the language. These are some general guidelines:

- Make optimal use of the learning material provided.
- Encourage students to speak in French. Errors in communication need to be overlooked as the focus should be on developing confidence in the student to communicate in French.
- Encourage pair work / group work for activities as activity-based learning is a great motivator.
- Organize a French Day. (Posters made by students, small skits, preparation of French dishes can be encouraged on this day).
- Emphasize the importance of the French National Day (14th July).
- Organize guest lectures; invite French natives and natives from Francophone countries based in India to share their experiences.
- Always discuss current topics related to France, India and Indo-French relations, as also those with Francophone countries.
- In schools where audio-visual equipment is available, short films and documentaries on France could be screened.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: The segment on "Civilisation" at the end of each lesson and the poems enable the student to go beyond the frame-work of the basic lessons. Hence, they should <u>not be</u> used for any formal evaluation in tests and exams.

For students:

«Le Français, c'est un atout!» is a coursebook for the learner. All learning material is organized and presented to make the learning of French interesting and enjoyable.

- Participate actively in all activities.
- Participate in pair / group work.
- Always try to express yourself in French during the French class. Never be discouraged by mistakes. The most important thing should be the need to communicate and express yourself.
- For Grammar, make tables and structures as these help in learning. You could make charts for your class.
- For irregular verbs too, charts could be made. It serves as a memory tool.
- Read up and use reference material in French.

For parents:

- Go through the course book yourself. It will be of interest to you too.
- Encourage your child in every possible way.
- Learning French is fun, it is extremely enriching and it is a huge advantage for your child.
