डिरेक्टरी ऑफ ओपन ॲक्सेस जर्नल्स (DOAJ)

डिरेक्टरी ऑफ ओपन ॲक्सेस जर्नल्स ही मुक्त स्रोत नियतकालिकांची डिरेक्टरी असून यामध्ये एकूण ७४ भाषांमध्ये नियतकालिके प्रसिद्ध होतात. ही सर्व नियतकालिके व यात प्रसिद्ध झालेले लेख आपणास स्क्रीनवर वाचता येतात. विषयानुसार लेखांचा शोध घेता येतो व हवे असलेले प्रलेख आपणांस डाऊनलोड करता येतात.

चला तर आपण या डिरेक्टरीमधून आपणास हव्या

असलेल्या लेखांचा शोध घेण्याचे प्रात्यक्षिक करू या.

सर्वप्रथम नेटवर्क ब्राऊझर ओपन करून गुगल होम पेज उघडा. त्यात DOAJ टाईप करा. त्यानंतर आपल्याला DOAJ होम पेज दिसेल किंवा नेटवर्क ब्राऊझरवर <http://doaj.org> टाईप करा म्हणजे डिरेक्टरी ऑफ ओपन ॲक्सेस जर्नल्स डेटाबेसचे होम पेज उघडेल. त्यात असलेल्या सर्व बॉक्समध्ये आपल्याला लेखकानुसार, नियतकालिकाच्या शीर्षकानुसार, की-वर्डनुसार शोध घेता येईल. त्याप्रमाणे प्रात्यक्षिक करा. प्रात्यक्षिकासाठी खाली काही स्वाध्याय दिलेले आहेत.

स्वाध्याय

1. DOAJ डेटाबेसमधील 'Electronic Journal of Knowledge Management' हे नियतकालिक शोधा आणि त्याविषयी थोडक्यात माहिती लिहा.
2. DOAJ डेटाबेसमधून ग्रंथालयशास्त्रावरील इंग्रजी भाषेत प्रकाशित होणारी दहा नियतकालिके शोधून त्यांची यादी करा.
3. DOAJ डेटाबेसमधून की-वर्ड (Keyword) च्या साहाय्याने खालील विषयावरील लेखांचा शोध घ्या.
 1. Web Designing
 2. Library Management
 3. Total Quality Management
 4. Library Automation
 5. Information Retrieval

शोध घेतल्यानंतर प्रत्येक की-वर्डनुसार किती लेख आढळून आले त्याबद्दल नोंद करून प्रत्येक की-वर्डचा एक लेख डाऊनलोड करा. सर्व लेख डाऊनलोड करून झाल्यानंतर या सर्व लेखांची यादी तयार करा व सर्व लेख Library Science या फोल्डरमध्ये साठवा व हा फोल्डर डेस्कटॉपवर ठेवा.

4. DOAJ डेटाबेसमध्ये लेखकानुसार शोध घ्या.
 1. Peter Brophy
 2. F. W. Lancaster
5. Library Classification ही संज्ञा वापरून DOAJ डेटाबेसमधील कोणतेही ५ लेख full text format मध्ये download करा. त्यासाठी Desktop वर Library Classification नावाचा folder तयार करून त्यामध्ये download केलेले लेख साठवा.

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
